Introduction

This leaflet provides you with information that you will find useful during your stay. If you are not sure about anything in this leaflet please ask a member of staff.

What is Lindisfarne House?

Lindisfarne House is one of three units within The Kenneth Day Unit which is part of Secure Care Central Business Unit, within Northumberland, Tyne and Wear NHS Foundation Trust. It is an enhanced low secure unit which offers assessment, care and treatment for male patients.

Who is it for?

The Kenneth Day Unit is for men with learning disabilities within a secure setting.

We have 24 beds for men who have come into conflict with the law, and/or are thought to be a risk to others or themselves.

These 24 beds split into 3 separate wards;

- Lindisfarne – 10 beds
- Wansbeck – 6 beds
- Cheviot – 8 beds

Why do I need to be here?

A doctor and/or the courts have decided it is the best place for you. Staff at Kenneth Day Unit will help you get the right treatment to get better. You will be given support and kept safe.

Staff are available to support you and help keep you safe during your time on the Kenneth Day Unit.

Arriving on Kenneth Day Unit

When you arrive you will be welcomed by a member of the care team. They will explain what will happen during your stay and give you information. You will have time to settle in and have a look around your ward.

How long will I be here?

The length of stay depends upon your personal needs. The care team will discuss this with you.

A member of staff will tell you about the section of the Mental Health Act, you are detained under and what it means. You will be given an information leaflet which will tell you all about what this means.

What sort of things can I do at the Kenneth Day Unit?

You will get your own bedroom on the unit. Each ward has shared areas, including a dayroom with colour TV and stereo, kitchen, quiet room and internal courtyards which can be enjoyed under supervision.

There are a number of groups on the Kenneth Day Unit that you will be expected to attend. Staff will explain this to you when you arrive.

During your assessment, you will work alongside your care team to collect information about your strengths and difficulties. Once your assessment period has finished, your team will work with you to create a treatment plan that is right for you.

Your treatment may include group work and/or 1-1 sessions with members of your care team.

Your treatment will be reviewed regularly by the Multi disciplinary team and you will have the opportunity to be involved in discussions about your care and treatment.

Activities you can be involved with

Part of your treatment will involve day activities, which may include:

- Adult education – reading, writing, social skills training
- Gardening and horticulture
- Art and craft work
- Gym sessions

There are also several kinds of social activities that you can take part in including:

- Using the gym
- Gardening indoor and outdoor sports like badminton and football
- Use of the multi-faith room for your religious and spiritual needs
- Regular social events

If you have a special interest or hobby, staff may be able to help you with it.

Students

As a teaching unit, students may be involved in all aspects of patient care. They will speak to you and ask for your consent if they are involved in any direct care, but if you do not wish for them to be involved in any other areas please speak to your named nurse or key-worker and let them know.

Interpreters

Staff can arrange an interpreter if you need one.
