

Preventing Falls

Information for carers, relatives
and visitors

Introduction

This leaflet gives help and advice when visiting a relative or friend in hospital.

If you have any questions please speak to a member of staff who will be happy to answer any questions you may have.

Falls Prevention and Advice

- If you consider a patient is at risk of falling or has had a previous fall, please tell the nurse in charge of the ward. In this way falls can be addressed and prevented whenever possible.
- Please let staff know if the patient usually has difficulty at home with tasks such as standing up from a chair, walking, dressing and using the toilet. Inform staff if they have difficulty being able to maintain their own safety at these times which may result in a fall.
- Following multidisciplinary assessment, a care plan will be agreed to address risk factors that may lead to a fall. In this way falls can be prevented whenever possible.
- Care Staff will be made aware if the patient has a visual/spatial awareness difficulty or has difficulty with memory that may necessitate a staff member to prompt the patient to use a walking aid or to assist the patient to walk to promote safe mobility at all times.
- Please tell a member of staff if the patient is usually unable to remember information and may forget to use their walking aid.
- Please tell a member of staff that you are leaving.

Talk to us

In the interest of everyone's safety, please tell a member of staff if you see a potential hazard in the ward, such as:

- Spills of liquid on the floor.
- Trailing wires/cables.
- Obstacles around the bed area.
- Any other hazard that may lead to a patient fall.

If you have any comments or suggestions on safety issues, please let the nurse in charge know. Thank you.
